SATURDAY CANDLELIGHT PARKING ATTENDANTS - 4-6 people to arrive at 7:30 and direct traffic

SATURDAY CANDLELIGHT LUMINARY TEAM - 6-8 people to arrive at 7:00 PM to set up luminaries and take them down after Candlelight Service

SATURDAY CANDLELIGHT SERVICE TEAM - 6-8 people to arrive at 6:30 PM to set up the service area, act as ushers, and help pass out candles; assist in taking down the chairs in the service area after Candlelight

ROSE PROVIDERS - Provide 36 roses for Sunday on the women's walks only

****NEW - SUNDAY MOVING** requires 2-3 **men** to move furniture from cabins to the conference room, to move kitchen supplies from the dining hall to the property room, and to move agape supplies from the inn to property room.

EMMAUS TEAM SERVICE - HOW TO GET INVOLVED

1. FACT OR MYTH? “I have to fill out an application if I want to serve on an Emmaus team.”

MYTH! Just let us know you are interested in serving, keeping in mind, of course, the commitment that you are making if selected for a Walk team.

Here's all you have to do:

1. Go to the website at www.hnec.org.
2. Click on the “Forms/Apps” button on the home page.
3. Open up the “2008 Team Service Interest Form.”
4. Print it out or refer to it.



Then you have several options:

1. Fill it in and mail it by “snail mail” to HNEC (address is on the form.)
2. Fill it in, scan it, and send it via email to: teamselection@hnec.org.
3. Look at the information it asks for and simply type an email to teamselection@hnec.org to indicate your interest and availability.

2. FACT OR MYTH? “I can work as a Day Servant if I can't commit to an entire weekend.”

FACT! The process is a little different from that of weekend team service, though, because the Servant Team Coordinator (STC) for each Walk is primarily responsible for finding and coordinating the Day Servant team.

SO, for Day Servants.....Here's what to do:

1. Go to the website at www.hnec.org.
2. Click on the “Forms/Apps” button on the home page.
3. Open up the “Day Servant Application.”
4. Print it out.
5. Fill it in.

Then you have two options:

1. Mail it by “snail mail” to HNEC (address is on the form.)
2. If you know the STC for the Walk(s) you want to work, send the form directly to him/her.

Do NOT send money when you send in the application. The STC will collect the daily fee once you have been confirmed to work.

EMMAUS TEAMS & SELECTION PROCESS

The purpose of the Walk to Emmaus is to renew the church as the body of Christ through the renewal of Christians as faithful and committed disciples of Jesus Christ. One way to participate in the renewal of the body of Christ is through Team Service. Serving others as they experience the love of Christ can renew and strengthen one's relationship with Christ in new ways.

1. What are the various types of team service?

In the Houston North Emmaus Community, each Walk has **ONE TEAM** with multiple members, each with designated roles and differing responsibilities, all working together in unity. No one team member is any more, or any less, important than any other.

The descriptions below provide information as to the specific responsibilities.

Day Servants - Kitchen, Chapel, and Agape Servants who work just one day at a time. For many people who cannot commit the time to an entire weekend, being a Day Servant is an excellent way to serve.

Full Weekend Team. The full weekend team is composed of persons assigned to:

- **The Conference Room Team:** Lay Director, Assistant Lay Directors, Spiritual Director, Assistant Spiritual Directors, Musicians, and Table Leaders/Assistant Table Leaders;
- **The Servant Team:** Servant Team Coordinator, Agape Servants, Chapel Servants, and Kitchen Servants.

2. How are persons asked or selected to serve on a team?

Teams are selected by the Team Selection committee, which is made up of two Board members who serve as co-chairs of the committee, along with six members of the Houston North Emmaus Fourth Day community: three men and three women. These Fourth Day members serve rotating three-year terms, in order to provide continuity in the selection process. Team selection begins 16 to 18 weeks before a Walk weekend. This committee works with the weekend Lay Director and Servant Team Coordinator to select the names to be called for a team. Names are accessed from the community database, from applications and interest forms submitted, or by persons suggested by members of the Committee.

The Team Selection Committee PRAYS about each Walk weekend, asking for God to guide the selection process. The use of a committee provides a broader awareness of prospective team members and their gifts, which helps the team selection process move beyond the limited circle of the friends and acquaintances of the Lay Director and Servant Team Coordinator. The Committee provides continuity in the selection process from Walk to Walk and provides guidance on developing new Emmaus leaders through progressive servanthood.

NOTE: You will NOT NECESSARILY be placed on the list of candidates or called for Walk team service *immediately* after submitting an application or indicating your interest. However, if you do NOT indicate your interest in team service via the form or via an email notification, your chances of being selected are diminished significantly! So if you are still waiting to be called, **TAKE ACTION NOW** and let Janie Gulley or Purvis Harper know you want to be considered. *Make sure we have your current email and phone contact information (see also Page 12!)*

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK**OF MUD HOLES AND OTHER TREACHERIES**

Not me, not this person who hates to make a mistake, or be in a vulnerable or embarrassing situation! No, no! My life is based on order and process and making as few errors as possible. When I do make a mistake, I have a natural tendency to try and fix it before anybody else finds out. When I do something stupid, I have to make sure that as few people as possible know about it.



Here's how it went down...The meeting was dismissed. Several of us had parked on a gravel driveway lined with trees on either side. It was very dark. It had rained quite a bit over the past several days, and there was standing water in various locations.

I got in my car, and backed up ever so slowly so as not to hit a tree. In my successful attempt at avoiding the trees, I found myself in a mud hole. The whole car—not just the front or back tires. In mud, up to the body of the car. The vehicle was so embedded, a place could not even be located to tie a tow rope to the underside of the car's frame.

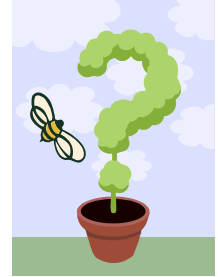
I may owe somebody some money for dry cleaning, 'cause there was lots of mud flying around. (Let me know, guys.)
