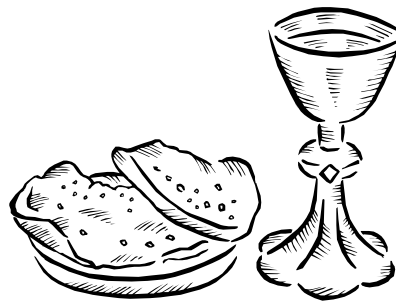

A TESTIMONY - AGAPE LOVE IN ACTION

Georgan Eyerman was a pilgrim on Womens' Walk 39. Georgan has a rare allergy to the substance gluten, which is found in many things, including most breads. However, a gluten-free bread is available.

When the Walk 39 team learned of Georgan's unique situation, the decision was made to use the gluten-free bread so that Georgan could participate fully in communion and so that all of the Walk members would be partaking of the same loaf of bread. It was not real easy to pull off, because the bread is expensive, it is not the most tasteful thing one has ever eaten, and it does not hold together very well.

Upon returning from the Walk, Paula Kirby, Georgan's sponsor, said she was talking with Georgan about her experience and had asked what part of the weekend was the most meaningful for her. Georgan told her sponsor that the most significant experience for her on the Walk was the care that went into making sure all of her dietary restrictions were met. Several weeks before the Walk, Georgan had been in the hospital, and the *hospital could not keep her dietary needs straight*. She was overwhelmed by the care, planning and love that went into each of her meals when even the medical people couldn't keep it straight.



And....here's the part that will knock your socks off...Georgan was so very thankful that she was able to participate in communion, because **it had been over six years since she had been able to participate in partaking of the elements**. We repeat...for the past six years...until Walk #39, in the Houston North Emmaus Community, in March 2007...Georgan would receive a blessing, but could not partake of the elements.

Here are the words of team member Janeen Ransom, when she heard this story:

“I thought, YEA, GOD!!!!!!! It wasn't easy to pull that off, and it was really hard at times to choke down that bread if it didn't crumble into the juice first, but WOW!!! It was one of the most significant and meaningful experiences for Georgan and through it she has been witnessing to the love of our Lord.”

SO...to all who were responsible for taking care of Georgan's special need, including the team, the kitchen, the dieticians, her husband, her sponsor, and other Fourth Day members--THANK YOU for being, in a very real, tangible, loving and sacrificial way--the Body of Christ for Georgan!

Saturday Candlelight Parking Attendants. Requires 6-8 people to arrive at 7:30 and direct traffic.

Saturday Candlelight Luminary Team. Requires 5-6 people to arrive at 7:00 to set up luminaries and take them down after Candlelight service.

Saturday Candlelight Service Team. Requires 4-8 people to arrive at 6:30 to set up the service area, act as ushers, and help pass out candles. They will also assist in taking down the chairs in the service area after Candlelight.

Rose Providers. Requires the provision of 48 roses for Sunday on the women's walks only.

SPONSOR INFORMATION

Houston North Emmaus Community Sponsorship Training/Refresher Required for HNEC Walks

Sponsorship is THE most important role in the Walk to Emmaus. Completion of this training or refresher is now required prior to the sponsorship of any pilgrim on any Walk in the Houston North Emmaus community.

Training sessions are provided by the HNEC Board immediately prior to each HNEC community gathering. Board members (see Page 11) are available upon request to meet with your church's local Emmaus community and provide training in that setting. Local churches and reunion groups are encouraged to schedule sponsorship training in conjunction with their local gatherings and reunion group meetings.

"Sponsorship is the act of your revisiting The Walk to Emmaus experience with the person whom God has laid upon your heart. Sponsorship is one of the most important aspects of The Walk to Emmaus and must be taken seriously. Sponsorship requires extensive prayer, diligent thought, careful planning and follow-through. The strength of an Emmaus Community is a direct result of its sponsorship practices." (a)

SPONSORSHIP TRAINING—FAQ's

Q: I have sponsored many pilgrims in the past. Why do I need training or a refresher course?

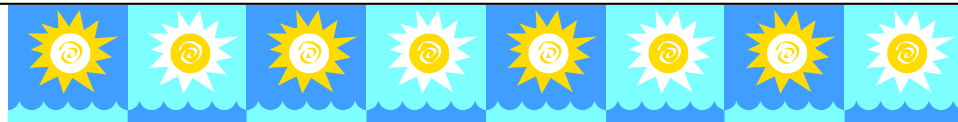
A: The training is to refresh sponsors on the latest changes in procedures, issues specific to the Kaiserhof facility, etc. Also, we want our sponsors trained so that they can be the BEST they can be and fully understand that the sponsorship process starts well before the Walk and continues long after the Walk.

Q: I do not live in the Houston area, but I have a friend or relative in the Houston area that I would like to sponsor. What are my options?

A: If you live outside the Houston area, you can be a CO-SPONSOR along with a primary sponsor who has attended training and who will be available for your pilgrim after the Walk. As a CO-SPONSOR, you can still be involved with your pilgrim before, during, and after the Walk, but the sponsor who is in the Houston area will be available for the all-important follow-up process, including reunion group, church involvement, and future Emmaus community involvement.

Q: I just can't get to training. What can I do?

A: See previous question. Be a co-sponsor and find a sponsor for your pilgrim who has attended training.

Walk placement **cannot** be reserved via email or telephone call--only by postmark on application.

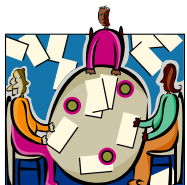

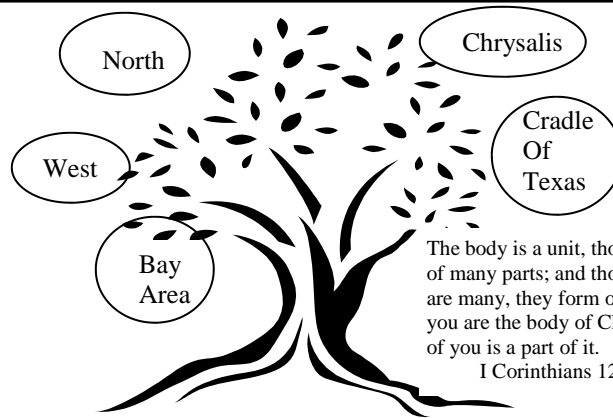
