LET'S TALK SPONSORSHIP !

Being a Good Sponsor

According to the dictionary, a sponsor is one who takes responsibility for another. The suffix "-ship" refers to the skill involved in the activity. So sponsorship is the skill of taking responsibility for another.

As we consider sponsorship, we must all be reminded of how we can be **good sponsors** of pilgrims for the Walk to Emmaus. Each time you sponsor a pilgrim, it would be a good thing to read the section in the Day Four book, The Pilgrim's Continued Journey.

The aim of a sponsor should **not** be "to get all my friends to go," to fill up the weekend, to fix people's problems, or to reproduce one's own religious experience in others. Rather, the aim of the sponsor is to bring spiritual revitalization to Christians who will, in turn, bring new life and vision to the work of the church in the congregation, home, workplace, and community. The aim of sponsorship is to build up the body of Christ.

Sponsorship is an act of love for God, for the participants in the Walk to Emmaus, for the Emmaus Community, and for the church. It is a demonstration of agape love. A sponsor will:

- Pray for the participant's openness to God's call to discipleship. Make an appointment with the participant (or participating couple) to discuss his or her participation in Emmaus.
- Invite the participant to take part in Emmaus for the sake of a more vital relationship with Jesus Christ. The sponsor shares his or her faith, explains the basic purpose, elements, and follow-up dimensions of the Walk.
- Ask the participant to make a commitment by filling out a registration form. If the participant is married, the sponsor will speak with both partners and encourage an equal commitment by both spouses. Support the participant's Walk through prayers and otherwise.
- The sponsor will also support the participant's family by house-sitting, baby-sitting, watering plants, picking up mail, feeding pets, or just checking in with a spouse to see if any help or support is needed. Encourage the participant in his/her continued journey and take the participant to Emmaus "gatherings" after the Walk weekend is over.
- Help the participant re-enter his or her church and consider ways to act out new commitment and enthusiasm.
- Help the participant sponsor others.

Wise Sponsorship

Initially, consider sponsoring those persons who are committed to living a life that is pleasing to God, those who want to grow and increase their knowledge and understanding of God and his will.

1. Church leaders (pastors and laypersons), those serving on committees, outreach programs, anyone participating in the ministries of the church.
2. Couples: Try to get them to go on the same set of walks or back-to-back walks.
3. Single persons who are active in the church.
4. Less active members who need their awareness of grace rekindled and their commitments renewed.
5. Christians who want to grow spiritually.
6. Members of **diverse** congregations, denominations, and ethnic groups. Many times these people are just waiting to be asked to do something.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SPONSOR

1. Spend concentrated time in **prayer** in an effort to discern whom God wants you to sponsor. The overriding purpose of Emmaus is to Christianize the environments such as the home, business, friendships, and churches. The whole weekend experience leads pilgrims to desire a reordering of priorities, to understand and experience God's grace within a community of believers, and to be drawn into deeper discipleship by the Holy Spirit.
2. Meet with the potential pilgrim and share with them some of the aspects of the walk: This may be an appropriate point to address the issue of "secrecy." One of the worst mistakes made by those of us who have attended the Emmaus Walk is to be too secretive about what happens on a Walk. The Upper Room Handbook on Emmaus states "**There is nothing secret about Emmaus.**" When your prospective pilgrim asks you a specific question, you should always give an honest and truthful answer. Chances are they aren't going to think to ask you about Candlelight or Dying Moments, but if they do, you should not try to deceive them. It would be better to tell them more than necessary than to be too secretive.
3. **Tell your pilgrim about the format of the weekend:**
 - o There will be fifteen talks, group discussions, and time for fellowship. It's fine to tell them about the type of food served, communion, and the sleeping accommodations. They will be with people they don't know, but in a short time they'll become a close-knit community. This experience will demonstrate the love of God and strong Christian fellowship. Hopefully, this will help to set their minds at ease.
 - o Also tell them about Reunion Groups and how they can help to encourage them in further spiritual growth.
4. After you have answered all questions, give your prospect an application (registration forms can be downloaded from the website). Be sure to explain the application. If you have a pamphlet or book on Emmaus, give this to your pilgrim.
5. We schedule based on the date registration forms are received. We will send postcards (if more than three months before the walk) and letters to both the pilgrim and sponsor within three months of the Walk. Let us know if your pilgrim can or cannot go on the assigned walk. **It is the sponsor's responsibility to advise the registrar of any changes such as change of address, phone number, or desire to attend the Walk.**
6. Begin preparations to request the personal agape letters; **12 LETTERS** are needed. Please be sure to get letters from family and good friends. Please ensure that the letters are marked correctly - "**Sponsor,**" "**Spouse,**" "**Pastor,**" "**Family,**" or "**Friend**" as appropriate. If you have more than 12, give the extra to the pilgrim after closing. Just be sure the most important letters are in the initial 12 the pilgrim will be given on Sunday. If you do not have

12 letters, people working behind the scenes (who probably don't know your pilgrim) will have to make up the difference.

7. A few days before The Walk event, contact your pilgrim as a reminder about the upcoming Walk. Offer guidance about what to pack for the weekend. There are guidelines in the letters sent to each pilgrim.
8. **Get your pilgrim to send off by 7:00 p.m., and assist with check in. Remain with your pilgrim through send-off, introducing him or her to others. Remember to be sure the pilgrim has eaten supper since only snack food is served Thursday night. Following send-off, the sponsor is to attend sponsor's hour.** At this time you have the opportunity to pray for your pilgrim and place their cross on the large cross.
9. Spend as much time as possible in prayer for your pilgrim. **Be a part of the 72-hour prayer vigil.**
10. During the 72 hours check on your pilgrim's family to provide necessary assistance.
11. Attend the Saturday candlelight service and take any additional agape letters you have collected. **Insure they do not contain gifts. Any letters containing gifts will NOT be given to the pilgrim.**
12. Be at closing.
13. Go to the **follow up meeting** and assist him or her in joining a reunion group.
14. Get the new member to a **gathering** and introduce him/her to others in the Emmaus community.
15. Teach the new Emmaus member how to be a good sponsor and be sure he/she understands the responsibilities of good sponsorship.
16. Tell the pilgrim how to serve the Emmaus community in future Walks.

Remember how you felt when you where a pilgrim and you attended your walk?

- Excited ~ You think you might understand what is going to happen but are really not sure!
- Nervous ~ You don't know many people and are in a strange new place!
- Apprehensive ~ A little afraid of the unknown!



Don't leave your pilgrim stranded and alone - be reassuring and excited for them!

Descriptions of Areas of Service

Thursday Snack Supper

Requirement: 6-8 people

Arrival time: 5:00 pm

Task: Provide light supper for team and arriving pilgrims and sponsors

Saturday Agape Dinner

Requirement: 6-12 people

Arrival time: 3:30 for decorations; 4:30 for food preparation, serving, and cleanup

Task: Provide special Agape Dinner for pilgrims and team. Fourth Day persons from multiple churches can join together. If you want to serve, let us know and we will put you together with others.

Saturday Candlelight Parking Attendants

Requirement: 4-6 people

Arrival time: 7:15 pm

Task: Direct traffic to designated parking areas.

Saturday Candlelight Luminary Team

Requirement: 6-8 people

Arrival time: 7:00 pm

Task: Set up luminaries for pilgrim arrival and take down after Candlelight is finished.

Saturday Candlelight Service Team

Requirement: 6-8 people

Arrival time: 6:30 pm

Tasks: Set up the Fourth Day service area in the Dining Hall; serve as ushers; hand out candles and then collect them; assist in taking down chairs in the Dining Hall after the Fourth Day service.

Sunday Moving Cleanup

Requirement: 4-5 people

Arrival time: 1:30 pm

Task: Move furniture from cabins to the conference room; move kitchen supplies from the dining hall to the property room; move agape supplies from the inn to property room; and to assist the servant team in the cleanup of Kaiserhof.

Rose Providers

Requirement: Individual or small group

Arrival time: Saturday night or early Sunday morning

Task: Bring 4 dozen (48) roses to Kaiserhof to be handed out to pilgrims, table leaders, and assistant table leaders in their rooms prior to breakfast on Sunday morning.

Website Update

HNEC has continued to move forward in our embracing of the ability of modern technology to make our registration tasks easier. Registration for pilgrims, team, and day servants may be done completely online using our automated pdf forms. They can even be "signed" electronically and forwarded to your Pastor for an electronic signature and then returned, so that a complete "paperless" registration can be accomplished. Instructions for completing the forms electronically are contained on the last page of the form itself once you have downloaded it.

You may also pay pilgrim, team, and day servant fees online for your convenience. A small handling fee is charged for this service, but you'll have the convenience of making immediate payment, an immediate receipt, and an email record of your payment without having to deal with a checkbook, envelope, addressing, stamping, etc.

Both electronic submission of registration forms and online payment are merely options which you can use for your convenience. If you are uncomfortable with doing things electronically you can still use the registration forms in any way that is convenient/comfortable for you, such as - printing them out, filling them in, and mailing them with your check; filling them in using your computer, then printing them out and mailing them, etc.


